## FREE TREES FROM NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY COUNCIL

The council is giving away up to 10,000 free tree saplings to help make Northumberland a greener and cleaner place to be. Eight different sapling species are now available to order online, which are suitable for small, medium, and large green spaces. They come with a biodegradable shelter guard and cane along with planting and aftercare instructions.

Collection points will be available across the county during November, December and January.


